## Document #1

Background: In the South American country of Chile, the government was ruled from 1973-1990 by Augusto Pinochet, a military general and absolute dictator. As a strong anti-communist leader, Mr. Pinochet used his country's military forces against "communist" rebels who were trying to overthrow his government. In Pinochet's war against the rebels, tens of thousands of people suspected of being communist rebels or sympathizers were kidnapped, tortured, jailed, or killed by the armed forces. Often, suspects were thrown from helicopters or planes into the Pacific Ocean, their bodies never recovered. The government refused to say what happened to them, simply telling those who asked that "they disappeared".

Based on this document, why is General Pinochet being charged with "Crimes against I	iumanity"?
